



DECEMBER 2022 NEWSLETTER

2022 has been a challenging year for Bio-Benin, with apologies for my silence since March, as I settled into Montreal and started seeking new ways to raise money for our endeavors.

Guillaume has been busy on the farm, the brewery and the restaurant and we accomplished the following:

- Harvested first crop of onions and garlic for use in the restaurant and for sale
- Trained an additional 10 cooking apprentices and helped them find employment
- Installed irrigation on all arable land and enriched organic content of soil.
- Built rabbit hutches for breeding 700 rabbits a year for the restaurant and for sale
- Acquired incubator to raise Goliath chickens
- Upgraded our website and started looking for additional sources of income
- Started the lengthy process of registering our land with the government.
- Inspectors visited our brewery and promised certification in February 2023 if we upgrade to meet government specs. This will provide a new source of income and allow us to start training apprentices in beer-making.
- Registered Bio-Benin as a non-profit in Canada, the first step in becoming a charitable organization.

GOALS FOR 2023:

- Reinforce fishpond and start breeding tilapia
- Receive certification and launch beer commercially
- Train at least 25 apprentices in beer brewing.
- Train 10 apprentices in restaurant cooking
- Identify manager of farm knowledgeable in organic farming
- Start breeding rabbits for the restaurant and for sale
- Start breeding Goliath chickens
- Expand cultivation of onions, garlic, potatoes, for sale
- Install beehives and bees and learn how to manage and harvest honey
- Increase visibility of Bio-Benin and level of donations
- Explore co-op model to attract senior staff trainers to farm at Bio-Benin
